### Assistant Principal's Message

Hello Morrill!

I missed you all while I was away, but am very grateful that we had a teacher like Mr. Alvernaz who was able to step up into a leadership support role during my absence. I'm looking forward to getting back into the middle school groove (though the elementary kids were cuter).

During the last month I've also received a lot of information regarding mental health and so I'd like to bring some of what I've learned back to help our students, our staff and our community. One of the things that we do not normally address as a school is grief. Our grief can be based on a number of things: a student who was doing well suddenly struggling with the new workload, parents seeing their child struggle with learning about themselves and those around them, or a teacher not sure how to reach out and address the needs of a student. This unaddressed grief can cause anger, denial, bargaining, and depression, all of which can lead to behavior issues, increases in illness, and in general an ever increasing anxiety to school.

What can we do to address this? We at Morrill will be looking deeply at these issues, but parents and students still have a huge impact on these as well.

- 1. <u>Listen more, talk less.</u> Sometimes the most effective approach in a situation like this is just to listen to everything your friend, student or partner has to say, even if it is hard to hear.
- 2. **Be present and authentic.** Put the phone away, turn away from a computer, but down the burger. Give them your real attention.
- 3. Accept their emotions. Don't tell them they're being crazy, don't tell them they need to toughen up. Saying those things increases their sense of shame and other emotions.
- Repeat back the ideas they are telling you. Don't repeat every word; don't add your own opinion, just saying it back to them lets them know you are hearing them.
- 5. <u>Get help if needed.</u> If you are worried about folks harming themselves, let others know. Call the school for help and we can direct you where you need to go.

This is a very stressful time of year. Tax season is coming, 8th graders are being informed of their ability to participate in the end of year activities and preparing for high school, 6th graders are realizing there are still two more years and 7th graders are realizing they'll be the 8th graders soon. Being there for each other is what makes our community strong. I look forward to being back for students, parents and staff and hope we can continue to build up our community.
